- CONTEXT-

This is a compilation of some significant events in the lives of six generations of the **Lallubhai Samaldas family** (3 generations up and 2 generations down; 1723 CE onwards), whose efforts, reforms and undertakings have played an important role in building our nation.

Our history books have ignored many such individuals who have silently contributed to the making of India.

Building organisations from scratch and dedicating them to the country is a Herculean task that this family has undertaken over generations.

At the same time, it is incumbent upon us to acknowledge and appreciate that other co-founders, successive officers at the helm, the employees and all the stakeholders along with various Government reforms have made nonesuch contributions in shaping these organisations since their inception, and making them what they are today.

 Establishing various game-changing reforms in the erstwhile State of Bhavnagar as Diwans (Chief Ministers) for four generations (1775-1900 CE).

In 1948, Bhavnagar became **the** first **Princely State** to join the Union of India.

- Starting India's first Indian-owned cement plant, shipping company and sugar factory
- Pioneers of the Co-operative Movement
- Laying down the foundation of banking systems in India
- Drafting committee members of the Indian Constitution and India's first fiveyear plan
- Pioneering work in the field of petrochemicals, audio industry, and others

What makes them extra special?


The founders of these institutions and companies chose not to leave any shares or assets for their descendants, focusing instead on creating a legacy driven by their passion and vision.

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FEW HIGHLIGHTS



RANCHHODDAS GABALDAS GEN 1 (1723-1796, 73 years)



- Born in Ghoghá (a significant port town and trading centre in Saurashtra since 5th century CE)
- Served under Damaji II, son of Pilaji Rao Gaekwad (founder of Baroda State)
- Appointed as Chief of Arab forces, rose to become the Chief advisor of Damaji II, and later on moved to Bhavnagar
- As the chief advisor (Karbhari), helped Maharaja Wakhtsinji of Bhavnagar to build and develop trade in the State



 Started a local bank at Ghoghá and Bhavnagar around 1780 CE





PARMANANDDAS RANCHHODDAS GEN 2 (1794-1850, 56 years)

संस्कृतम् ।

 A doyen of Persian and Sanskrit languages



 Appointed **Diwan** of Bhavnagar by Maharaja Wajehsinhji



 Revitalized commerce through the port of Bhavnagar using his sharp business acumen



 Rebuilt the State's economy, which was in a poor financial condition due to a terrible famine



 Made persuasive proposals to the Bombay Government to restore civil and criminal jurisdiction in Bhavnagar







 Scholar of Sanksrit, Brijbhasha and Persian



Began as a Revenue officer, then appointed Magistrate under Diwan Gaurishankar Oza (his maternal uncle), and Maharaja Wajehsinhji



 Stood his ground and turned back spurious accusations against Maharaja Jashwantsinhji by the Political Agents **Superintendent** Police and of Ahmedabad



• As Chief Judge played a major role in establishment of civil and criminal courts in the State



- Appointed as **Diwan** by Maharaja Takhtasinhji



• Helped start the first school for girls



 Helped establish railways in the entire Kathiawad region, a hospital in Bhavnagar, and in the expansion of Rajkumar College, Rajkot



 Opposed the Bombay Government for retaining control of the saltworks in Western India



Introduced major reforms like right of land ownership, improved land and sea-customs, and also built water-storage tanks in the villages and towns



In 1881, the British Government declared Bhavnagar as the "best governed Native State in the Provin ce".



Received the village of Jalalpur as a gift from the Maharaja



Samaldas College established in 1885 by Maharaja Takhtasinhji in his memory

(was the third college in Western India after Elphinstone College, Bombay and Gujarat College, Ahmedabad)

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VITTHALDAS SAMALDAS GEN 4 (1846-1915, 69 years)



 Educated at Bhavnagar and a scholar of English Literature and Mathematics



 Began working with his father (Samaldas) and Diwan Gaurishankar Oza



 Rose from the Political Department to Judge to Revenue Commissioner to **Diwan**



 Member of the management committee of Rajkumar College, Rajkot



Helped establish the Land Revenue

Code that saved farmers from the clutches of money-lenders



 His new house got the area to be renamed "Diwanpara" in Bhavnagar



 Set up the Vitthaleshwar
Mahadev Temple in Bhavnagar for travelling sanyasis



LALLUBHAI SAMALDAS GEN 4 (1863-1936, 73 years)



 Following matriculation from Bhavnagar, attended Elphinstone College, Bombay



 At the age of 18, began as Revenue Commissioner in the State of Bhavnagar (elder brother Vithhaldas was Diwan)



 Helped start Bhavnagar Electricity Company, and introduced several administrative and revenue reforms in the State



 At the age of 36, moved to Bombay (1900 CE)





• One of the first owners of a car in Bombay



 Member of the Legislative Council of the Bombay Government



 At Shri Gopalkrishna Gokhale's request, introduced Shri Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi to the Government and business circles in Bombay



 Founded India's first cement plant at Porbandar (1913 - now a part of ACC), the first shipping company at Bombay (Scindia Steam, 1919), first sugar factory at Baramati (Nura Valley Sugar, 1921)



 Co-founded India's first cooperative bank (Bombay Provincial Co-op Bank)



 Co-founded Bank of India (1906) and Bank of Baroda (1908; Chairman 1921-35)



- Director in Advance Mills, Tata Hydro and
- TISCO for life



Pioneer in the life insurance sector



 Co-founded Indian Merchants' Chamber (IMC), Bombay (President, 1917)



• Co-founded Sydenham College, Bombay



 Knighted by King George V at the Buckingham Palace, London (1926)



 Honorary Secretary of Seva Sadan (Bombay) for life



 Remembered as the "Father of the Co-operative Movement in India"



The Lallubhai Park area in Andheri West, Bombay has been named in his honour





VAIKUNTH LALLUBHAI MEHTA GEN 5 (1891-1964, 73 years)



 An outstanding student at Bharda Murzban School and Elphinstone College in the subjects of English and Maths




 Quietly transferred his scholarship to a poor student. That was Shri Mahadev Desai, who later became the lifelong private secretary of Mahatma Gandhi



 Awarded Kaiser-i-Hind Medal (1916) for his service to the co-operative movement



 Worked for 35 years as CEO of Maharashtra State Co-operative Bank



 Most trusted lieutenant of Mahatma Gandhi in the Khadi (homespun cotton) movement



 Founder and Chairman for life of Khadi
Village and Industries Commission (KVIC)



• A member of the drafting committee of the Indian Constitution



 Upon the insistence of Gandhiji, Sardar Patel and Shri BG Kher, became the first Finance Minister of the Bombay State (1946)



 Vice-Chairman of the State Bank of India under John Matthai as chair



• Did not accept any remuneration (as

Minister or as chair of KVIC, or in any other post whatsoever) throughout life



 The first Gujarati to be awarded Padma Bhushan (1954)



- Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Co-operative Management (VAMNICOM) set up in his memory at Pune (1964)
- On the **25th anniversary of NDDB**, Dr. Verghese Kurien (Chairman, NDDB) produced a documentary film on him



 The road from Hotel Tulip Star (Juhu) upto SV Road, a Park and a Cooperative Housing Society in Andheri, Mumbai are named after him







 An avid enthusiast of botany and astronomy, educated at St. Xavier's College, Bombay



- Co-founder and chair of Union Co-operative Insurance, Bombay
- Director and chair of firms including the Hindustan Construction Company (HCC), Premier Auto and several others



 President of Andheri-Vile Parle Borough Municipality (for two terms)



 Co-founder of the Andheri Recreation Club



GAGANVIHARI LALLUBHAI MEHTA

GEN 5 (1900-1974, 74 years)



 Studied at Elphinstone College, and later became a Fellow of the London School of Economics (LSE)

INDIAN TARIFF BOARD

• **President** of FICCI (1939-43), and the Indian Tariff Board (1947-52)



 Member of the Indian Constituent Assembly (1947)



 Member of India's First Planning Commission with Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru (1950-52) as chair



• India's Ambassador to USA and Mexico (1952-58)





 The first Gujarati to be awarded Padma Vibhushan (1959)



 Member of Nalini Ranjan Sarkar's committee that recommended setting up of five Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs)



 Chair of Hindustan Shipyards and the National Shipping Board (1958-63)



 Chair of Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (1959-1971)



• A member of the **Board of Directors** of Air India and Indian Airlines (1965-67)



 Chair of the board of governors of IIT Bombay (1965-71). Memorial lectures in his name are held at IITB.

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JAYANT JYOTENDRA MEHTA GEN 6 (1916-1996, 80 years)



- One of the youngest in India to get a pilot's license (at age 17)
- After graduating from Royal Institute of Science, Bombay, did his postgraduation in Chemical Engineering from MIT (Boston, USA) in 1939



 Helped build the National Rayon factory at Kalyan (Maharashtra)



Founder CMD of IPCL, Baroda (1967-74) (was invited by Prime Minister Indira Gandhi to start this first industrial "mega" project of India)



Member of the board of governors at

IIM Ahmedabad (1969-74)



Founder Chairman of GACL and GSPC (1974-83)



Brainchild behind Sardar Patel
Planetarium in Baroda



NIKHIL JYOTENDRA MEHTA GEN 6 (1935-2021, 86 years)



• **Bombay University topper** in M. Sc. (Inorganic Chemistry) from the Royal Institute of Science



- Self-taught expert in electronics and audio recording technology
- Co-founded a world-class corrugation plant at Charkop (Bombay), serving top brands across India



 Co-founded Sudeep Studio (1977) one of India's first home-based professional audio recording studio

(recorded several prestigious projects, and many star musicians of today debuted here)




 Co-founded SudeepAudio.com (1999) -India's first pro-audio online store
